### Brief Narrative of Safety Topics Covered

**\*\*Required Personal Protective Equipment: Use clothing and equipment appropriate for the job. At a minimum, field work requires long sleeved shirts, long cuffless pants, sturdy footwear, gloves, eye protection, ANSI approved hard hats.**

***Volunteers signing the attached 301B form have received this Tailgate Safety Briefing.***

Use PPE to minimize risk: Hard hat, gloves, safety glasses, appropriate clothing, sturdy shoes

Stay hydrated and take plenty of water and food.

Weather-related hazards: Heat exhaustion, hypothermia, thunderstorms, flash floods

Slips, trips and falls, overhead hazards (snags and rolling rocks)

Maintain separation and awareness of coworkers and other trail users. Let others know if you are passing. (Maintain the blood circle - swinging distance of tool). Carry tools at your side on the downhill side.

Use extra care with sharp tools. Ask for instruction on tool use if you need it.

Hazards: ticks, venomous snakes, bees, poison ivy.

Hazards associated with cutting blowdowns - bind, springpole, weight. Don't exceed your level of training.

If you are allergic to bee stings, make sure you have an epi-pen.

Let the leader know if you have any special medical issues, such as diabetes.
